Subject:- Grant of conditional permission to Lalit Hari State P.G. Ayurvedic College & Hospital, Dal Chand Pilibhit, Bareilly-262001, Uttar Pradesh (Inst. ID-AYU0245) with 35 seats (44 seats including EWS) [instead of 50 seats (63 seats including EWS)] in UG (BAMS) course and 04 seats (05 seats including EWS) [instead of 06 seats (08 seats including EWS)] in PG Dravyaguna Vigyana from the academic session 2023-24 under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020 for the academic session 2023-24-regarding.

Sir/Madam,

With reference to the subject mentioned above, I am directed to inform you that in pursuance of the provision of National Commission for Indian System of Medicine Act, 2020, the Indian Medicine Central Council Act, 1970 (48 of 1970) has been repealed with effect from the 11th day of June, 2021. With effect from the said date, the Central Council of Indian Medicine constituted under sub-division (1) of section 3 of the Indian Medicine Central Council Act, 1970 (48 of 1970) shall stand dissolved. Now, in exercise of the powers conferred by sub-section (3) of the section 1 of the said Act, the Central Government hereby notifies that all the provisions of the National Commission for Indian System of Medicine Act, 2020 has been come into force with effect from the 11th day of June, 2021.

- Further, to assess the available facilities of teaching, non-teaching, Hospital staff, practical training and other infrastructure facilities at your college namely **Lalit Hari State P.G. Ayurvedic College & Hospital, Dal Chand Pilibhit, Bareilly-262001, Uttar Pradesh (Inst. ID-AYU0245)** inspection of your college was conducted on **09.05.2023 & 10.05.2023 on Hybrid mode as** a part of annual visitation by the visitation team of Medical Assessment and Rating Board, NCISM to process **the Conditional Permission with 50 seats (63 seats including EWS) in UG (BAMS) & 06 seats (08 seats including EWS) in PG Dravyaguna Vigyana from the academic session 2023-24 under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant regulations thereunder.**
- Further, in view of above, the visitation report and all other related documents were assessed in terms of enforced regulation namely, the "Indian Medicine Central Council (Requirements of Minimum Standard for under-graduate Ayurveda Colleges and attached Hospitals) Regulations, 2016", The Indian Medicine Central Council (Post Graduate Ayurveda Education) Regulations, 2016 and provisions under the NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant Regulations there under. On examining the case in light of above notified and approved criteria and on perusal of the visitation report, it was observed that the college was not fulfilling the basic eligibility criteria due to following shortcomings: -

(viii) Observation by the visitor:-

- Documentation needs to be improved in all IPDs.
- Library books in all departments were found inadequate and diverted from the central library.
- IPDs found functional with deficient number of patients.
- Surgical departments need to be improved.
- Teachers of other departments like Rachana Sharir were sitting in Shalya OPD.

f) PG scholars of Dravyaguna have been shown as RMO and EMO.

3. In view of above, the assessment report was placed in the **45th Board meeting** of Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine (NCISM) on **30.06.2023**. On careful examination of the assessment report, considering the deficiencies observed therein as mentioned above, the college was given an opportunity of virtual hearing vide the MARBISM letter (Hearing notice) of **even no.** dated **11.07.2023** to appear on **14.07.2023**, before the designated Hearing Committee to present their case and to show cause as to **why not the conditional permission to the college with 50 seats (63 seats including EWS) in UG (BAMS) & 06 seats (08 seats including EWS) in PG Dravyaguna Vigyana from the academic session 2023-24 under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020 be denied for the Academic Year 2023-24.** The applicant college was directed to make written submission in respect of the case and produce all relevant valid documents/records/proof to substantiate the claims against all the deficiencies/shortcomings as indicated above. The representatives of the college submitted written submissions **vide letter no. 621/NCISM/2023, dated 12.07.2023** against the deficiencies conveyed to them.
4. Whereas, the college through its representatives, **Dr. Sudip Bedar, Principal** appeared before the Hearing Committee on **14.07.2023** and made their submission virtually as well as written submission against the shortcomings communicated to the college. The shortcomings communicated to the college, submission made by the representatives of the proposed Ayurveda college and observations made by the Hearing Committee are as under:-

- ii. Presently there are 14 HF working in the institute. $14/15 \times 100 = 93.33\%$
- iii. Service Contract of Yogeshwar Pandey (Teachers Code AYSN00186) got expired on 8th of May 2023 and therefore he was not available on the day of visitation. His service contract has been renewed, he has joined again on 16.06.2023 and presently working as Lecturer Sanskrit with us. (Annexure I)

- iv. Process of promotion and recruitment of Faculty is underway. New faculty is expected to join soon. (Annexure V)

- v. 1. Dr. Ajay Kumar Agarwal working as Reader at the time of visitation has been promoted to the post of Professor. Process of recruitment of Readers and Lecturers is underway. New faculty is expected to join soon (Annexure III, IV, V)

The Principal submitted that the college have 24 eligible faculty. The committee, after, going through relevant documents found that the **number of eligible faculty is only 21** (Excluding the excess staff)

Availability of total teaching staff for UG is $\frac{\text{Available}}{\text{Required}} \times 100\% = \frac{21}{30} \times 100\% = 70.00\%$ (Excluding Excess)

2. Hospital staffs:-

- a) Resident Medical officers working with us have been inadvertently entered as EMO's in Part I. Two EMO's have been re-designated as Resident Medical Officers. Presently 09 RMOS and 06 EMOS are working in the Hospital (Annexure VI).

- b) Request for appointment of deficient Staff has been sent to the Director Ayurveda Services, Uttar Pradesh Lucknow and is expected to be completed soon. (Annexure VII).

2. a) The Principal submitted that 2 EMO were redesignated as RMO and at present 9 EMO and 6 RMO are functioning. **He also admitted that all these 15 EMO/RMO are PG Students.**

Therefore, the total number of Hospital staff is 49 only

5. The observation of hearing committee based on the submission made by the college representatives during hearing and assessment report of the NCISM have been carefully re-examined in terms of Regulation 3 of the "Indian Medicine Central Council (Requirements of Minimum Standard for under-graduate Ayurveda Colleges and attached Hospitals) Regulations, 2016", "The Indian Medicine Central Council (Post Graduate Ayurveda Education) Regulations, 2016 and provisions under the NCISM Act, 2022 and relevant regulations thereunder, **and once again as per the direction of President, Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine (NCISM)**, the recommendation of Hearing Committee was placed in the **48th Board meeting** of Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine (NCISM) on **20.07.2023**.

6. In view of the observation of Hearing Committee based on the submission made by the college representatives during hearing and assessment report has been carefully examined in terms of concerned Regulation and provisions under the NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant regulations thereunder, and board decided that the college is **not fulfilling the criteria for issuance of Conditional permission for UG (BAMS) Course and for PG course under section 28 of NCISM Act 2020 for the Academic Session 2023-24, but Board decided to issue Conditional Permission as per the approved Seat Reduction Policy in accordance of Section 28 (1) (f) of NCISM Act 2020 for failing to maintain the minimum essential standards for the Academic year 2023-24, wherein it is mentioned that:-**

a. "For deficiency of **every one teacher**, seat reduction in the intake capacity shall be considered by reducing the intake strength by 5 % of total intake capacity."

Accordingly as per Schedule-V Note (iii) of MSR 2016 the deficiency of teacher for up to sixty intake capacity shall not exceed more than ten percent of total requirement. As per the Hearing Committee observation and approval of Minutes in the 48th Board meeting of MARBISM, college is having only 21 total eligible Teaching faculty.

There is deficiency of 06 teachers for issuance of Conditional Permission for academic session 2023-24 as per Schedule-V Note (iii) of MSR 2016. **Therefore, in accordance of seat reduction policy 2023-2024, for deficiency of every one teacher, seat reduction in the intake capacity shall be considered by reducing the intake strength by 30% of total intake capacity.**

7. Further, as per regulation 16,(1) & (2) of IMCC (Post Graduate Ayurvedic Education) regulations, 2016, The teacher-student ratio shall be such that the number of post-graduate teachers to the number of post-graduate students admitted per year is maintained as 1:3 in case of Professor and 1:2 in case of Reader or Associate Professor. The teacher student ratio shall be 1:1 in case of Lecturer or Assistant Professor having minimum of five years teaching experience.

Accordingly, as per the Hearing Committee observation and approval of Minutes in the **50th Board meeting** of MARBISM, college is not fulfilling the required teacher student ratio in the following department for PG:-

(1) **Dravyaguna Vigyana**- 01 Professor and 01 Assistant Professor with minimum 05 years teaching experience are available. Hence fulfilling for 04 seats instead of 06 seats.

Hence, after applying the seat reduction policy 2023-24 and regulation 16,(1) & (2) of IMCC (Post Graduate Ayurvedic Education) regulations, 2016 under section 28 (1) (f) of NCISM Act 2020 the college is fulfilling the basic eligibility criteria for issuance of **conditional permission with 35 seats (44 seats including EWS) [instead of 50 seats (63 seats including EWS)] in UG (BAMS) course and 04 seats (05 seats including EWS) [instead of 06 seats (08 seats including EWS)] in PG for Dravyaguna Vigyana for the academic session 2023-24 under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020.**

8. Therefore, in view of shortcomings and deficiencies mentioned as above, **Conditional Permission is issued to Lalit Hari State P.G. Ayurvedic College & Hospital, Dal Chand Pilibhit, Bareilly-262001, Uttar Pradesh (Inst. ID-AYU0245) with 35 seats (44 seats including EWS) [instead of 50 seats (63 seats including EWS)] in UG (BAMS) course and 04 seats (05 seats including EWS) [instead of 06 seats (08 seats including EWS)] in PG for Dravyaguna Vigyana for the academic session 2023-24 under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant regulations , with a warning on the following shortcomings and subject to fulfilment of the following conditions:-**

A. Shortcoming:-

I. There is shortcoming in following hospital staff listed below,

- II. Average bed occupancy %-There is shortcoming of 5.88% against 50.00% required as per MSR.
- III. Labour room is non-functional and total number of deliveries conducted from 1st Jan 2022 to 31st Dec. 2022 is 0.
- IV. Number of operations conducted from 1st Jan 2022 to 31st Dec. 2022 is 15.
- V. Ksharasutra block is non-functional and the number of Kshar sutra procedures conducted from 1st Jan 2022 to 31st Dec. 2022 is 57.
- VI. Central Research Laboratory is not available.
- VII. Animal house is available but not functional.

B. Conditions:-

- I. It is further informed that minimum 15% of undergraduate seats of the permitted intake capacity **with 35 seats (44 seats including EWS) [instead of 50 seats (63 seats including EWS)]** and minimum 15% of postgraduate seats of the permitted intake capacity **with 04 seats (05 seats including EWS) [instead of 06 seats (08 seats including EWS)]** shall be treated as All India Quota. The counseling for seats under All India Quota shall be conducted by respective counseling authority as designated by Central Government for A.Y. 2023-24 and counseling for the remaining 85% seats or as the case may be, shall be conducted by the concerned counseling authority of that State/UT. **The permission of the college stands withdrawn if the college fails to comply with the aforesaid direction of the Central Government/NCISM for All India Quota or the students admitted thereunder.**
9. Admissions made in violation of the above conditions will be treated as invalid and action will be initiated under NCISM Act & Regulations thereunder.
10. Further, **as per Sub-section (7) of Section 29 of NCISM Act, 2020**, The Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine may conduct evaluation and assessment of any University or medical institution at any time, either directly or through any other expert, having integrity and experience in medical profession, without any prior notice and assess and evaluate the performance, standards and benchmarks of such University or medical institution and if the college is found to be not maintaining the Minimum Essential standards as specified in the concerned Acts & Regulations then **in accordance of Section 28 (1) (f) of NCISM Act, 2020 the issued permission of the college shall deemed to be withdrawn and denial of permission shall be issued by MARBISM for stoppage of admission for that particular or the subsequent academic year.**
11. Discrepancies, if any, may be immediately brought to the notice of Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine, NCISM.
12. **The following requirements should be fulfilled by the college by 31st December, 2023 and send a compliance report to get permission for the session 2024-25: -**
 - i) All the requirements of Minimum Standard of infrastructure and teaching & training facilities as specified in Regulation 3 of the "Indian Medicine Central Council (Requirements of Minimum Standard for under-graduate Ayurveda Colleges and attached Hospitals) Regulations, 2016;
 - ii) All the requirements of the Indian Medicine Central Council (Minimum Standards of Education in Indian Medicine) Amendment Regulations, 2016 (for Ayurveda).
 - iii) All the requirements under the provisions of the NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant Regulations made thereunder should be fulfilled in toto.
 - iv) All the requirements of Indian Medicine Central Council (Post Graduate Ayurveda Education) Regulations, 2016, for grant of permission of PG courses
 - v) All the shortcomings as mentioned above in **point no. 8. A.**
13. The fulfillment of the conditions given above may be made within the time period specified and compliance report should be submitted by the college to President, Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine. The Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine will verify that the conditions have been fulfilled for considering the permission for the academic session 2024-25.
